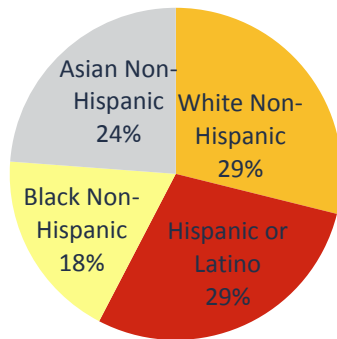


Queens County and Queens Library

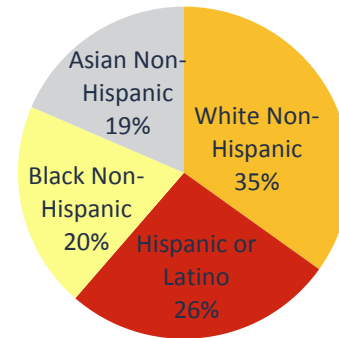
- One of 5 boroughs in NYC

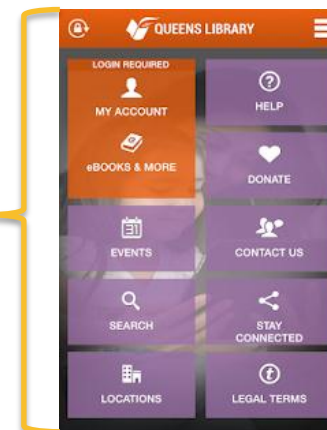


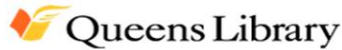
